July Council Recap

The Council Approved construction of the Pantry as Phase 1 of the Kitchen redesign. The Council endorses a kitchen project that is completed in as short a time as possible, that expands the square footage of the kitchen to accommodate current priorities, and reviewed possible funding sources. The Council chose to pursue prequalification for a \$100,000 loan from the ELCA Mission Investment Fund and proposed calling for a special congregational meeting to support that decision. Informational conversations for the congregation were scheduled for July 14 and 21 to discuss the kitchen.

Pr. Erik reviewed the revised position descriptions and proposed work schedules reflecting priorities for 32 hour work weeks for staff during the summer months.

The council hear about Property items including the visit from Anne Gerrietts from the Mission Investment Fund, repairs to the main sanctuary A/C unit (leak fixed and recharged), and additional problems with the church van).

Proposed 2019 updates to the St. John's Employee handbook were circulated at the Exec meeting.
