

Travel that Inspires Faith

My wife, Lainie, and I traveled quite a bit after I retired. One place that really touched us was our visit to Ephesus in Turkey. The old seaport and trading center is now far inland because the old harbor silted in.

I remember visiting the shrine of the Virgin Mary. According to tradition, John brought Mary to Ephesus after the crucifixion of Jesus. In Jesus' words from the Cross, He tells the disciple "this is your mother." It was an incredible feeling, standing there, knowing that John and Mary walked on that site. There is a shrine by a small cottage where Mary may have actually lived out her life. People have left messages and notes. The city also has a large coliseum where the Apostle Paul walked and preached. Julius Caesar and Marc Anthony also walked in the city. I studied history in school, and this was a powerful connection for me.

We also visited Rome and went to the Vatican. We saw the Pope, but he was far away and we could not see much. But walking through the area was a unique experience for a Norwegian Lutheran. On another trip, we sailed up the Rhine and one of the stops was the city of Cologne in Germany. There is a famous cathedral located in Cologne that took 700 years to complete. It was incredible.

We are very fortunate that God has given us the health and financial ability to travel in retirement. We have many more trips planned, and we are looking forward to hitting many of them. It is wonderful to see great sites of our planet and view what God has created.

Discernment Process among South Central North Dakota ELCA Congregations

Overview

The Planning Team met April 19 and worked through the next steps for our discernment process.

- 1. A short video presentation introduces the two models to all eight congregations. The video will be used in all of the congregations to introduce the two models.
- 2. Diagrams of each of the models will be used in the video and be available for handouts.
- 3. At each of the congregations time will be allotted for questions, comments, and conversation about the models. The video presentation and the conversation time will be led by representatives from the local congregation and/or representatives from other participating congregations.
- 4. All congregation members who view the video and/or participate in the follow-up conversation will be invited to complete the Congregation Consensus Poll. This will measure the level of agreement and support for both of the options.
- 5. The video presentation and Consensus Poll will be available online at the congregations' websites. Those who want to view the video and complete the poll who were not able to attend the other meetings will be able to do so.

Future Steps of the Timeline

April 24—May 15 First set of Options will be presented to each congregation for feedback Anyone from any congregation is welcome to attend whichever presentation works best for them. Sunday, April 24 10:00 am at St. John's

Sunday, May 1 10:00 am at Atonement (across from Jamestown High School)

Wednesday, May 4 7:15 pm at Trinity

May 20—June—Refined options and a recommendation from the Planning Team will be presented to each congregation. Congregations will be asked to decide whether or not to continue as they are or to accept the recommended option(s) and begin implementing those plans.

Every option being developed will share these core values:


- Jesus Christ calls these congregations to be in mission in our communities

Or this kind of cooperation can be very informal, like the cooperation of our congregations to host an evening of painting for youth at Atonement Lutheran in May with the artist, Pastor Paul Oman, who provided the videos of miracles of Jesus painted on a grand scale to bring a deeper understanding to these miracles.

Another kind of cooperation is the kind that happens one on one between neighbors and friends. I've heard many stories of caring for one another during these past couple of years that have really touched my heart. One woman invites her neighbor to her apartment to participate in the 10:45 am livestream. Together they share communion with the whole congregation as this holy meal of Jesus is extended to them in the apartment living room. Another couple found comfort from the church after their neighbor knew they were going through a difficult health crises and suggested that they give the pastor a call because our church is open to everyone. Driveways shoveled. Garbage cans returned home after their wind blown adventure. A warm meal brought to a family following the birth of a child. Each of these one on one acts shows the love of God living through us.

Jesus prays that we who believe in Jesus may all be one. One in faith. One in love. One in our witness to neighbors who see the love of God through these acts of caring.






