Throughout my life I have been part of four Lutheran congregations: Concordia when I was a young child, Pingree when I was in second grade through high school, St. John's for about five years, and Trinity for about the past forty years.

I found my faith when I was young. My faith became stronger in the last two plus years since my son's near fatal accident. He has had to relearn so many skills such as walking and talking and has made miraculous progress during this time. I have appreciated being able to usher with him and set up for communion at worship services. We have even helped with the projection of the slides during worship so people can see the words of the prayers and the hymns. These may seem like small things, but they are big signs of his recovery.

I retired from traffic sign sales for forty years. I retired just before my son's accident. I enjoy spending time with family and doing things with friends.

My favorite Bible story is Noah's Ark because of the promise that after the rain there's not going to be flooding again that covers the whole world and God has stuck with that promise. To have faith like Noah when he built that ark is amazing. Everyone must have thought he was crazy but he kept at it, doing what God told him to do.

I'm a Lutheran because my parents and grandparents were Lutheran. I never had a desire to change to a different religion.

Serving on the Church Council opened my eyes to how much money is needed to make the organization run. It also opened my eyes to how great things are when people work together.

I was part of the team that worked on a photo directory for Trinity. It was wonderful to connect with people as they made appointments for their pictures and as we called to make sure their contact information was up to date. There are so many people in the congregation that I might not get to know well but talking with them about the photo directory gave us a reason to connect.

Synod Connections

On Sunday, April 2, all the area ELCA congregations were invited to join Dakotah Oyate Lutheran Church on the Spirit Lake Reservation for a special Celebration of Ministry service to bless their new worship space! Bishop Tessa and Deacon Erin from were present from the synod office along with a representative from the Churchwide staff. Festivities included a Palm Sunday celebration, new worship space dedication, and a meal.



This was a very special gathering for the community! They have been worshipping together in the same building for many years, and have been anticipating and praying for additional space for their ministry. After the project was delayed by significant roof damage to the church building, the space was finally complete and ready to use.

Tokio Lutheran Mission began as a Baptist ministry for unwed mothers, but was taken over by the Lutheran church in 1956. Over the following decades, the church has helped inspire joy, hope, and healing to oppressed people who often felt worthless. Though he started his relationship with the ministry over a decade ago, through the TEEM program, Pastor Larry Theile went to seminary and was ordained to serve with Dakotah Oyate. Under his leadership, the congregation continues to flourish.



On Palm Sunday, Pastor Stephanie and Char Freeberg drove up from Jamestown to join the worship space dedication and celebration. The service began in the old sanctuary where Pastor Thiele shared a brief history of the congregation. Then the sounds of the drum circle filled the air as the Dakotah Oyate members and guests joyously processed with our palms down the hall to the new worship space.



The presence of the drum circle was very special as they have not always been welcome in worship by former leaders of the congregation who refused to acknowledge native expressions of faith. Pastor Larry explained a bit about how the Dakota culture influences and enhances their worship time and life together. Everything down to the paint colors holds special significance.

Bishop Tessa led the dedication service, which included blessing the altar, pulpit, and font; and a celebration of both our Lutheran sacraments: Holy Communion and Baptism! After the service, tables were brought in, and a celebratory meal was shared. It was a beautiful service and meal, and I am thankful that Char and I made the trip.



CREATIVE FELLOWSHIP IN ACTION



Each month a group of crafters take over the St. John's Fellowship Hall for a weekend of crafting, visiting, and sharing. Scrapbooking, Card Making, Quilting, and Hand Knitting were all taking place in April. Beginners to Experts are welcome. Bring your own supplies, or just drop by to see what might be needed for a project you have in mind. This is great bunch of people coming together for a time of working next to other people.



Angie, Joy and Maggie are hand knitting Chunky Blankets— It takes about 3 hours to do a 3x4 blanket for those who are experienced. There is a basic pattern, but some can be combined in different ways including a chevron patten and a cable knit pattern. People can do it while visiting, or sitting on the couch at home. They can be made in any size you want.

Rebecca and Sheree spend time quilting- using up all the scraps, given a pattern and it will be quilt at the end. Quilts made by Rebecca are donated to Roger Maris in Fargo. She says, "I can be as creative as I want, do any size that I want." She adds, when there is something that I can't figure out, or am struggling, sometime I think Aha. Jordan was present for the very first time and was being shown some basic quilting techniques.



Disciples AND Apostles

After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." Acts 1:3-5

In the days after Easter we encounter the risen Christ. He returns from the grave, triumphantly, and then he spends 40 days with his disciples (those who follow) teaching them how to be apostles (those sent out). At the end of the season, on Ascension Day (May 18th this year) he ascends into heaven. The Disciples return to Jerusalem and wait to become the Apostles. On Pentecost (May 28th this year) they are baptized with the Holy Spirit and are empowered to go out and spread the Good news of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

This month we are invited to remember that, we too, are disciples, followers of Jesus. We are called, like Peter, James, John, and all the rest to follow Jesus. We are invited to learn from Jesus about how the Kingdom of God has come near. We are commanded, like those who gathered with Jesus at the Last Supper, to love one another like Jesus loved.

Yet, we are also apostles, those who have been baptized by the Holy Spirit and sent out to share the Gospel. Like the women at the tomb, we are sent to "go quickly" and tell everyone that, "Jesus has been raised from the dead!" We know the story of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. We know many who need to hear this good news! Many who struggle to see joy or hope or love in their daily life. We are the ones sent out to be God's messengers about God's love for all the world. Having encountered the risen Christ, having been baptized by the Holy Spirit, we must be apostles, sent to offer a word of hope and resurrection for a world in need of Good News!

Council Recap

The council met April 17th. In the first order of business— Pam Musland was appointed to the office of Secretary until the next congregational meeting. Our insurance agent, Jason Bitz gave an update on the upcoming change in our insurance provider. One proposal is in hand, and more are being sought before June 1st. Problems with ice-dams on the Centennial Hall roof this winter were discussed as well as recognition of Tom Enderle and crew for their snow removal efforts this year. The council agreed with the proposal to open two new money market accounts to seek some interest income from our bank deposits. The Christians in Action update included clarification about an Intern that has been assigned to Gackle and Trinity, starting in January. The Youth Ministry Director candidate is a Deacon and a Call Vote is scheduled at Trinity for May 7th, with a possible start date of July 1st. The Youth Ministry Associate position needs additional congregations to commit funds to make an offer. St. John's has committed our share of funds for both youth ministry positions out of our existing operating budget. Lawn care for the summer was discussed and the first plan will be to schedule congregation youth who want to earn credit toward future youth trips. The volunteer appreciation lunch will be on May 24th, with Pr. Stephanie coordinating a meal.

The other team made and sold snow cones. Did you know that blue snow cones are more popular than red snow cones? By the end of the evening, the snow cone makers had expanded their talents into red/blue combinations. With the white ice, these were a very patriotic option for snow cone fans.



In addition to having fun and bringing joy to children and adults attending the circus, each youth and adult volunteer earned \$30 toward future Christians in Action partnership events.
