I'm a Lutheran

Perlebergs have been part of St. John's for a long time. I remember past days when relatives would stand out in front of the

church for an hour or an hour and a half visiting after Sunday worship. I grew up in this congregation and aside from 12 years at 1st English Lutheran Church in Menahga, MN, I've been here all of my life. I have worked in carpentry/general construction, spent 12 years as a teacher, and part time at Menards. I have worked as the St. John's custodian since 2008. It was the hardest thing I've had to do in a long time to write my letter of resignation effective at the end of this month.

I found my faith as a teenager sitting in the balcony at St. John's. I don't remember the pastor or the song, but I remember part of the sermon where the preacher said that if you are only here for 1 hour a week for worship, and don't do anything else all week, what's the point. I also remember my dad, a farmer, who didn't let chores get in the way of getting to church every week. I remember that he said, when I die, no one else in this family will every go to church. I proved him wrong.

I'm fighting to help people treat each other better. When I work at Menards, I see how a culture can help people feel seen and treat them well, not like some other stores that I visit. My favorite bible story is David and Goliath. The fact is that if ever anyone was overmatched, it was David facing that ol' giant. If anyone ever showed faith in God it was David. I believe that if you are not part of the solution, you are part of the problem. I also see that the longer you know someone the worse you can treat them. That bothers me. I struggle with people who act like they are better than someone else.

In almost all of my life and work positions, I have been able to talk with people about God. It is easy for me to talk with people and share my faith. I also talk with God. Prayer is just a conversation with God. I have had lots of them, at night, during the day- It doesn't matter. People are surprised that I'll talk to anybody. I give my time to people and keep an open mind when I talk with them. Overall, I've had it pretty good. I don't get to excited about anything. I try and maintain a steady, even flow. If I got too excited about everything, I could never have been a Vikings fan all these years.

I'm a Lutheran because the rest of may family was Lutheran. I probably could be happy in a bunch of different denominations. I've never traveled abroad, but I've met many kinds of people in my life than I can count, especially working carpentry. It is amazing what you can hear if you stop and talk to people. I had the chance to meet lots of Native Americans during college and I loved listening and talking with them. Serving on a school board and on church councils has taught me how people perceive problems. Some see an opportunity to do something. Others put their head in the sand and say I can't change that. If you don't fight for what you think is right, it is not going to get any better. One of my sayings is, "It is always darkest before the dawn."

Castaway Youth Retreat

On a rainy afternoon, at the end of September, we filled both 15 passenger church vans to capacity and headed for Minnesota. Twenty-five youth and five adults, from four congregations in the Christians in Action partnership headed for Castaway, the Synod youth retreat on Pelican Lake. For forty hours, youth in 6th - 10th grade worshiped, sang, socialized, created art, played games, ate great food, and even slept a little. They heard the message that they are known and noticed by God. The organizers told us, "In the world of Snapchat, Tik Tok and Instagram, our youth understand what it is like to be "seen" but to be KNOWN - that's a different story. We are true master-pieces. Together we will explore how we can look at ourselves and others the way God sees us." This is a message that resonated with the youth that attended.

It was a blessing to travel with youth and adults from multiple congregations. Watching as the kids made new acquaintances and became friends in such a short time was an affirmation of the partnership we've formed. Banding together and sharing chaperones and resources allowed more youth to attend, and allowed more to hear the Good news that they are seen, known, loved, and cherished by God. Next year we hope we need more vehicles!





Council Recap

The St. John's Council met on October 11th. In addition to receiving the minutes of the Oct. 9th Special Congregational Meeting, reviewing and approving the minutes and financial reports, the council approved updates to the position descriptions for the Senior Pastor, Associate Pastor, Administrative Secretary/Bookkeeper, and Custodian. The council approved the renewal of the English/Trinity/St. John's Framework of Agreement until November 30th. The council also approved a new agreement for pastoral services to outline the new status of St. John's and English until January 2024 (renewals set to coincide with annual meetings). The council reviewed the proposal from the Christians in Action partnership for a new area Youth Ministry Director. The council agreed in principle to be a partner in the position. Deferred maintenance priorities were reviewed and additional information about an extended warranty on the van was requested. Pr. Erik reported that staff reviews have been completed. Several items regarding preparations for Pr. Stephanie were covered, including authorization to purchase a new laptop compatible with the St. John's network and printer for her use. A nominating committee was discussed and names were proposed on people to contact to serve alongside Cindy Kleven and David Gasal. The next council meeting will be Nov. 15th at 6 pm.





For ALL the Saints

"Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man.... But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸bless those who curse you...Do to others as you would have them do to you." (Luke 6 selected)

Our appointed All Saints' Sunday gospel reading takes a portion of Jesus' teaching called the Sermon on the Plain. It is another opportunity for Jesus

to speak to "a multitude" gathered together to be healed, cleansed, and seen. Jesus uses this occasion to reinforce the unexpected ways that God acts in the world. Our expectations are turned upside down. God's expectations build a world where we are welcomed, satisfied, and content.

One of my recent funerals was for a community member who had a tough life. He looked different, he dressed different, and spent a lifetime dealing with bullies and was often picked on. At times he was homeless, or unemployable, or uninsured. I believe that if you had asked him while he was alive if he felt blessed, some of these challenges would have come up. Many people today, especially tweens and teens know what it is like to be excluded. Many people, regardless of age, know the pain of having things said about them that are not true. Harsh words hurt and linger. We remember the tone, or glances, or phrases of comments that wound us. It is surprising that Jesus names as blessed all of these who encounter this rejection. Yet Jesus does not stop there: Jesus calls on us to love the very people who attack, exclude, or lie about us. Jesus calls us to love our enemies.

It is appropriate to give thanks this All Saints' Sunday for the ones we love who have died. It is appropriate to remember how God's love was shown to us through their lives and to light a candle as we remember them. There are some people that it is easy to love. Jesus also calls us to also shower radical love on those who have hurt us deeply. Yes, this is complicated and challenging. Yes, this takes work and effort. This radical love takes practice. As we give thanks for the Saints in our lives this year, we remember the song that begins, "For all the saints..." These are the ones that are easy to love and the ones that are a challenge. Jesus looked at the crowd pressing in on him: people from cities and farms, coastlands and hill country, Jewish or Samaritan and offered an image of God's great reversal. The people who seem abandoned and lacking now, will be welcomed and whole In God's kingdom. Jesus calls on his followers to love their enemies and to treat others as they would like to be treated.

Light a candle for a loved one who has died. Light a candle for someone who has mistreated you in the past. May you observe a blessed All Saints' Sunday.

Christians in Action

Christians in Action now includes eight ELCA congregations participating in a first set of goals. Montpelier Lutheran has asked to join the partnership from November 2022 through May 2023 as they determine the next steps for pastoral leadership following the retirement of Pastor Kerry Boese effective October 31.

Updates on current actions:

St. John's and English have voted to call Stephanie Gossett to be the new Associate Pastor for the two congregations. (see page 9 for additional information)

The search team for a Director of Youth and Family Ministries provided a draft position description and set of responsibilities to the councils of the partner congregations to review in October. The current goal is to have the position posted before Thanksgiving.

Curators of a shared "Treasure Chest" of resources will begin their work. This will be an electronic list of physical items and electronic resources each congregation has that they are willing to share with the other congregations. If you are aware of items that would be appropriate to share, please speak with Char Freeberg (at St. John's) or Joni Zink (at Trinity) so the items get into the Treasure Chest.

A new opportunity has arisen to invite a pastoral intern to learn and serve in the partnership for the 2023-24 academic year. The application to host an intern is due at the end of January so each congregation council has time to consider how they would like to be part of the internship process. The intern will likely work with one primary site but also be part of the partnership along with the other pastoral leaders. Some funds to support the internship will be requested from the Synod Endowment Fund (see page 7). Housing expenses will depend on which community is serving as the primary site and whether a parsonage is available in that community. The intern will serve in addition to the current team of pastoral leaders and those who are yet to be called through the ongoing call processes in the southern congregations of the partnership. Anticipate hearing more about this opportunity as congregations prepare for January and February annual meetings.

Eastern North Dakota Synod Endowment Fund for Vital Leaders

How can we attract new leadership to the Synod? How can we retain the rostered ministers that are serving in our Synod? One of the ways is through the Synod Endowment Fund.

"The Synod Endowment Fund for Vital Leaders was established in 2000 by the Eastern North Dakota Synod Council to sustain rural ministry and enhance quality pastoral leadership. The fund is intended to maintain viable ministries and sustain congregations in rural eastern ND for years to come." This fund helps the Synod recruit and retain pastoral leadership. Using the interest earned by the fund, there are multiple grants that are given to pastors serving in the synod, congregations, and seminary students.

The first grant is for pastors who are currently paying off student loans. "The grant amount is a percentage of what is paid by the rostered minister over the course of the year." The amount increases based on years served in the Synod, which rewards those who remain in Eastern North Dakota longer. It also incentivizes making higher payments to student loans in order to access more grant money and thus pay off education loans more quickly. The second grant supplements the pensions of rostered ministered serving in congregations that are unable to meet synod guidelines for retirement accounts. It allows pastors to serve a congregation without compromising their pensions.

Recently, the Endowment Committee has added the option for congregations to apply for grant money if they intend to host an Intern Pastor from one of the Seminaries. This allows congregations to be a place for seminary students to spend a year learning hands-on congregational leadership. The grant money covers the cost of the internship which includes a stipend for the intern to live on. Hosting seminary interns in Eastern North Dakota increases the possibility that those interns will return to the Synod after graduation.

Finally, each semester funds are sent to Seminary students from Eastern North Dakota Synod to help cover the cost of their education. This allows the students to breathe easier financially. It also shows them that their efforts are supported by their Synod. That support and encouragement make them more likely to return and serve in the Synod they came from.

The Synod Endowment Fund is a vital tool as we seek to attract new Pastoral leadership to the synod.





Welcome Pastor Stephanie!!

St. John's and English Lutheran voted on October 9th to call Stephanie Gossett as Associate Pastor. As of the writing of this article, she is still waiting for the Letter of Call to reach her after passing through the Eastern North Dakota Synod Office for the signature and seal of the Bishop. After she receives the Letter of Call, she has 30 days to accept or decline the call. All signs point to her acceptance and joining us as a leader. Stephanie's ordination service (which is contingent on her acceptance of our call) is scheduled for Sunday November 13th at 3 pm at Peace Lutheran Church in College Station, TX, her home congregation. Installation services at English and St. John's are still being scheduled.

The English Lutheran parsonage will be her home and we anticipate that she will move in around Thanksgiving. St. John's and English share the cost of the position evenly and will each receive 20 more hours of pastoral services each week. Specific schedules and duties will be developed over the coming months. It is expected that both Pr. Erik and Pr. Stephanie will provide pastoral services at both English and St. John's. Some weeks Pr. Erik might spend 10 hours with English and Pr. Stephanie might spend 10 hours (20 hours total). Other weeks the split may be different.

It is expected that in November, English will say goodbye to Trinity Lutheran leaders Pr. Kristi, Pr. Susan, and Wendy as regular worship leaders, administrators, and pastoral care providers. After 21 months of leadership, we give thanks for their presence and stability. English and St. John's now begin a new chapter of ministry together.

A hypothetical sample schedule might have Pr. Stephanie in both Jamestown and Medina for Sunday worship, and offering a Medina youth group opportunity on select Sunday evenings. Monday could be dedicated to Medina office hours and visitation. Tuesday and Wednesday would involve planned trips to Jamestown for staff meeting, text study, visitation, and confirmation.

Thursdays involve sermon preparation, Synod Conference meetings, and scheduled appointments. Friday would be a day of sabbath rest.

It will be very important to have overlap time for Pr. Erik and Pr. Stephanie over the first six months. That may mean that they are both leading worship or participating in confirmation for a time. It may mean that both lead nursing home services or go to visit people together for introductions.

We look forward to what God has in store for us in our ministry together.
