With every challenge we'll encounter we have an opportunity to improve. We are already very aware the path we will take if we do nothing. I, for one, do not want to follow that path. I am now a father-in-law. As my son, Henrik, exchanged vows with Lexie on September 7th, I was sitting proudly in the front row. Neither Kristi nor I had an official role in the ceremony, other than to be escorted in by our firstborn son and be seated with Lexie's parents. A friend of the family from Illinois officiated at the service that was held in an old Presbyterian church that had been relocated to a former Methodist Bible camp near Moose Lake Minnesota. It was a very select guest list, at least as far as family were concerned, there were the absolute bare minimum of family members and a whole lot of Henrik and Lexie's friends. The weather was cool and dry. The day was perfect for a wedding.

This was the first child in each family to get married. Grandparents beamed. Our younger son, Oscar, was the best man, and Lexie's sister the maid of honor. Here is what I remember from the ceremony- not much. The bible readings were a psalm and passage from Philippians. The wedding sermon was pleasant and appropriate. The ring bearer - my nephew, did his job as well as can be expected. Nobody passed out (don't lock your knees) and in front of God and parents, and the whole gathered assembly vows were exchanged. The Kleenex in my pocket was not needed, but my eyes are moist now a few weeks later remembering the dav.

Sometimes the feeling of a day is a more powerful memory than any individual word that was said or song that was sung. I experienced this in a new way on that day. It is not unknown to me. I have officiated at weddings and funerals, and am aware of how people experience God differently on

such occasions. God works though the special clothes, or the presence of friends and family, or the tone of the day. I remember the smiles. I remember the feeling of joy and completion of watching my child take one more step into his own life and world. I am a new participant in this reality. I am now a father in law. Pr. Erik

I thought of the times where I was told that I was growing up so fast and thought that I wasn't growing fast enough. I know understand what that all meant. It seems that time keeps going the rate that it is meant to go no matter if we want to move it faster or slower. Even though change is hard, God has continues to be with us through these changes and growth. When life unexpectedly changes and you end up discovering a new normal, it conjures up anxiety and doubt.

Recently Rachel, Yogi, and I just moved to a new house and it is the first time Rachel and I are residing in a house. When you move you learn more about the guirks of the new space, which rooms you can be in while not disturbing your partner, donating items that don't fit, and buying new furniture. Moving creates a whole new identity, the emotions of excitement, anxiety, and doubt all rolled up together. The good news is that when change happens unexpectedly, we are reminded that God is there with us. Isaiah 43:18-19 "Forget the former things, do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

As God creates streams in the wasteland, what streams has God called us to find? I challenge this church to notice the time when the streams that once provided nourishment for the congregation are dried and buried and when there is a time to dig for a new stream. For example, we created a stream by

September Council Recap

Language updates to the St. John's Employee Handbook were approved. The council reinvested \$50,000 of designated funds from Maturing CD's. The council received an update that St. John's has been conditionally approved for a \$100,000.00 unsecured loan through the Mission Investment Fund for Kitchen remodeling. President Gary is gathering the Kitchen Team for next steps. The Budget Committee for the 2020 Mission and Ministry Plan was appointed: Charlotte Freeberg, Grace Walz, Paulette Schumacher, and Shane Ede (and possibly Ron Fuchs). The council received the written reports from the March Ministry Site Review and the June Building Consultant visit. The Council members will read and return to these reports at a future meeting. The council discussed guidance for the Budget Committee as they prepare for their work this fall.

October is Endowment Awareness Month

Did you know that every time we celebrate a baptism at St. John's, the family receives an invitation to receive a matching gift to a special Mission Future 4 Kids account in the child's name? That matching gift comes from the St. John's Ц Endowment Fund. Setting aside small amounts Z 00 regularly adds up over time. Many grandparents and parents make special gifts to children so that they will have resources to use in the future- whether that is for education, a wedding, or starting a business. As a congregation we try and encourage financial health for our children. We can do this because people in the past set aside some resources for us today. We hold those resources in our endowment.

An endowment is nothing more than funds or property donated to an institution to produce income. St. John's has three Endowment Fund Options that are all available to provide ongoing support to the mission and ministry of the congregation.

Endowments don't just happen, they require planning, care, and cultivation. Farmers and gardeners who are gathering the produce of the land know that corn or beans or tomatoes don't just spring up by themselves. It takes a seed and an intention to set out to grow a crop. Endowments work best when they are

visible and celebrated and cultivated. Endowments are for the long haul- they are a blessing across generations.

Current Gifts and Deferred Gifts are valuable for the health of our Endowments. But we know that these gifts don't happen by themselves- they take intention and action.

Take a moment to pray and reflect on your own intentions.

- 1) Review the people and places that have been important to you in your life.
- Decide if you want to make any specific provisions through your will or beneficiary designations to see that your wishes are carried out. Talk and pray with one of the Pastors as you discern your gift.
- 3) Act on your decision. Talk to your legal, tax, and financial advisors to set in motion your plans.

If you could make a real difference for the future of Christian Ministry through St. John's, would you do it? Endowments can receive almost any kind of gifts

> -gifts of cash or cash equivalents -gifts of houses, property, or farm land -gifts of stocks, bonds, or mutual funds -beneficiary designations of retirement plans or life insurance

The most provocative question that can be asked may be: "If your children cannot make it (be set for life financially) on 90% of what you have accumulated, what makes you think that they will make it on 100% of what you have?" Consider designating 10% of your estate as a tithe of what God has blessed you with in your life.

In the past years, the St. John's Endowment Committee has been cultivating the Endowments of St. John's. In 2017, the St. John's Lutheran ND Tax Credit Endowment Fund was created and has already received several gift. This year, the Media Legacy Fund sponsored three radio broadcasts. The St. John's Endowment continues to support the witness and mission of St. John's through grants for people, activities, and things that witness to Jesus.
